1. Public hours are 10 a.m.-6 p.m. Saturday and 10 a.m.-4 p.m. Sunday. All set-ups and camps must be completed by 9:30 a.m. both mornings. Tear down may begin at 4:15 p.m. Sunday.
2. This is a pre-1840 weekend. All participants are to be in garb AT ALL TIMES when outside of their tent the entire weekend. Do not change into street clothes after public hours unless you are leaving the Seven Eagles grounds.
3. All displays, set-ups and products must be appropriate for pre-1840 events. No aluminum poles, chairs or tables, and no plastic tarps, bags, coolers, etc., are to be visible to the public. Keep all modern conveniences WELL HIDDEN. Please keep cameras and phones used as cameras covered when not in use. Keep phones out of sight and use them only inside your tent out of the view of the public or other reenactors. Use cups, mugs or period drinking vessels and dispose of cans/bottles quickly and properly. All wares offered for sale must be pre-1840.
4. No vehicles will be permitted within the perimeter of the festival between 9:30 a.m. Saturday and 4:15 p.m. Sunday. Be sure you have all the stock/belongings you will need before moving your car to the parking area. Vehicles should be out of camp as soon as possible after set-up and no later than 7 p.m. Friday. Only people arriving Saturday morning will be allowed to have vehicles in camp Saturday morning to unload.
5. During set-up, keep in mind there must be a path wide enough for emergency vehicles to drive around the pond and reach all other camp areas. We usually don't rope off designated camp areas, but if you're setting up in the driving area you may be asked to move.
6. Please park in the area designated for participants.
7. No pets, horses or animals of any kind are permitted on the premises at any time. Please do not leave dogs unattended in your vehicle. **Service dogs must be officially registered and comply with ADA regulations. Service dogs must be registered with Seven Eagles PRIOR to the event. NO EXCEPTIONS.
8. Stay out of the fields adjoining Seven Eagles. They are private property.
9. No swimming. Fishing – catch and release only — must be with period-correct equipment only. Please do not throw stones or litter into the pond. The pond is home to the endangered cricket frog.
10. Alcohol is not permitted during public hours. Anyone in violation will be asked to leave the grounds.
11. Dig fire pits and replace sod when you are finished. Please return unused firewood to wood piles. Leave your campsite as you found it.
12. Parents — children are your responsibility! Do not leave them unattended. Children ages 15 and younger must have adult supervision to participate in shoots, archery, hawk & knife or similar competitions or demonstrations.
13. Obscenity and indecency will not be tolerated. This is a family-oriented event and the reputation of Seven Eagles depends on your actions — both with the public and with other participants.
14. Respect your neighbors' sleep times in regard to evening activities. Quiet time begins at 11 p.m.
15. When building fires, please maintain a conservative size and do not leave fires unattended. Please keep at least 2 gallons of water beside your fire at all times.
16. Firewood, portable toilets and well water are available on site. Please bring your own water for winter events.
17. If you, as a participant, see a minor infraction (such as visible plastic or cell phones), please mention it PRIVATELY and KINDLY to the offending party or refer the matter to an event coordinator. If the violation persists after you mention in NICELY, please refer the matter to one of the event coordinators. This is why we appoint one or two people to be in charge. If you see a major safety issue, please report it to an event coordinator, range officer or other appropriate person immediately. Thank you!
